Vision for Squash

Squash remains a niche sport, much loved by those who play it. We need to work to increase the visibility of squash, particularly following the failed bid for inclusion in the Paris Olympics in 2024.

ESF are supporting global development of squash via funding the World Squash Officiating platform which is due to be launched in early 2020. At European level, we recently provided training for Tournament Directors from our member nations in the use of Tournament Software. Further initiatives such as these are needed to support and promote squash.
